Online seminar by Professor Tariq Modood, University of Bristol

On March 30, 2023, an online seminar on "Multicultural Nationalism" by Professor Tariq Modood of Bristol University (England) was held. Professor Modood is one of the researchers of Islamophobia and multiculturalism. Dr. Orkhan Valiyev, the head of the Department of Political Sciences and Philosophy of Khazar University, Tarlan Orujova, the deputy dean of the School of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences, and students participated in the online seminar. Issues of nationalism and multiculturalism were covered in the seminar. Professor Modood analyzed the extent to which national identity is multicultural. After the presentation, students' questions were answered.

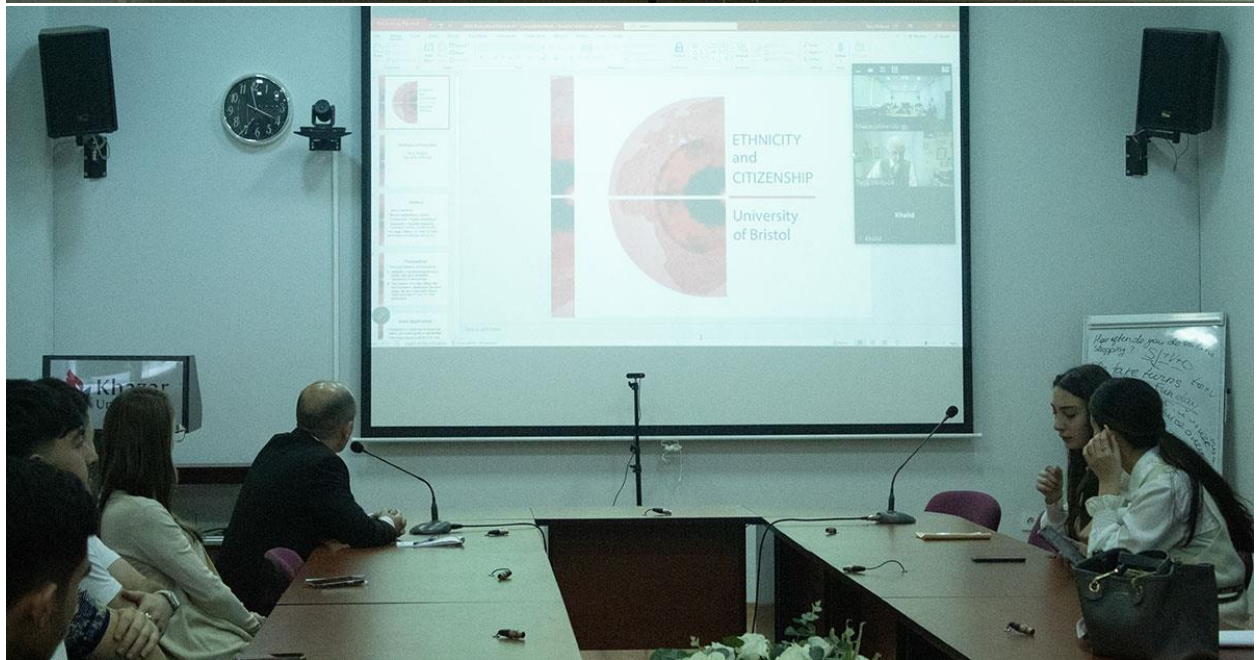
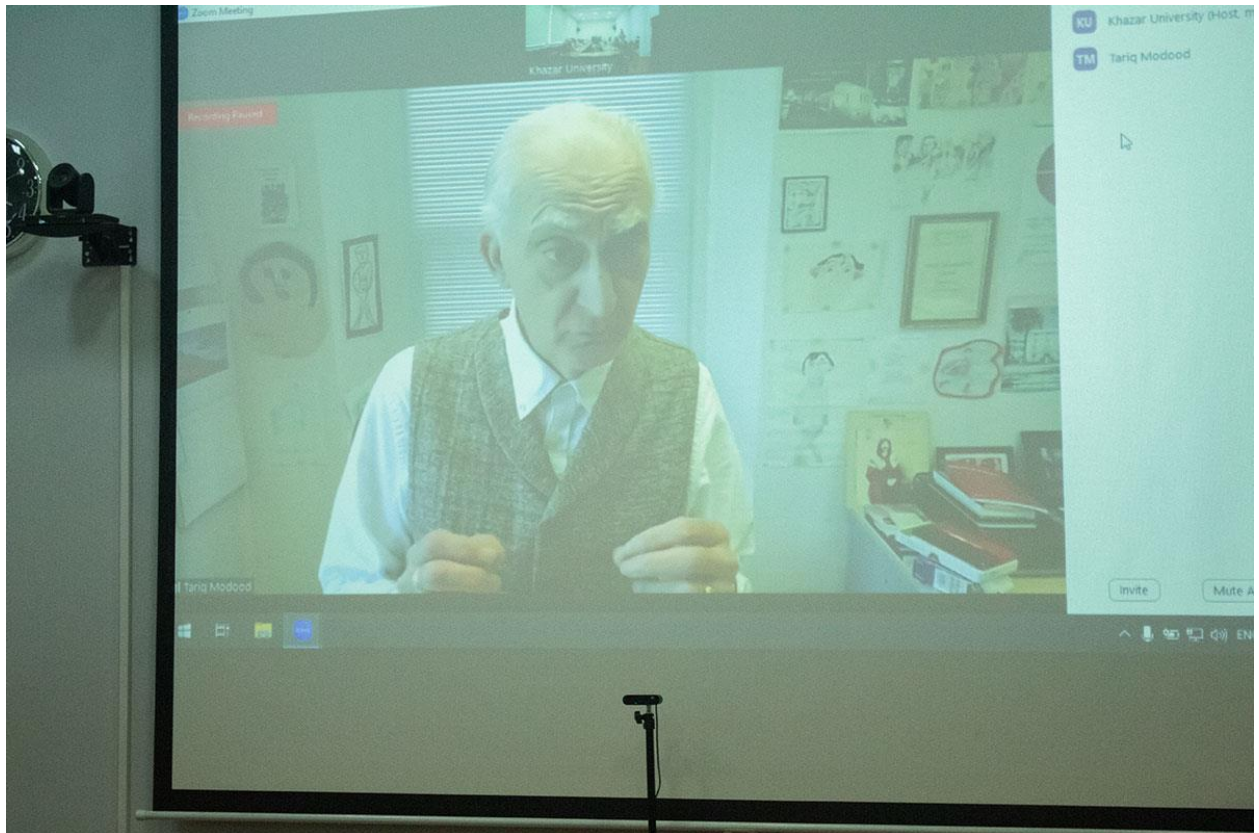

Multicultural Equality (1)

1. Protection from and challenging racism, cultural racism and Islamophobia, inel in dom or majority culture in relation to laws, structures and 'representation' (but not the majority culture *per se*)
2. There should be no insistence on assimilation but nor should there be any hindrance against uncoercive social processes of assimilation or self-chosen assimilation; different modes of integration should be equally welcomed
